Camp Information

Payment and Fee Information

- Camp fees (minus deposit) are due eight weeks before the start of camp and payable via bank draft from a savings or checking account or with credit card. Full payment is required for children to attend camp.
- Registration fee is per child and per program. Deposits are forfeited when a week is canceled.
- Registration fees and deposits are NON-REFUNDABLE, NON-TRANSFERABLE and due at registration.

Refunds and Schedule Changes

- Schedule changes may be honored if space permits; schedule change requests are not guaranteed.
- Weekly Camp fees may be refunded or credited if the request is made MORE than four weeks before the start of the camp week.
- No refunds or credits will be issued within four weeks of the start of the camp week.
